4. Dumfries Young Curlers Update:

John Graham updated that everything was progressing well, with a full house for the competition last Monday evening.

6. Council Business / Facility Update:

Stuart communicated via Alex that the vending machines for the bar arrangements were not feasible. So far, the response and comments have been positive with Sulwath Breweries who have provided bar facilities last month.

There is still a possibility of the Sharks bar staff (who are all volunteers and therefore their availability may be limited to a certain degree) may be able to assist at other times.

Any requests for Catering Services for any Curling events must be made by email – this is to ensure an efficient and reliable service.

Katie apologised for the recent disruption to service levels, due to a very high level of sickness within the staff.

An invitation is to be made to the Catering Manager to the next User Group meeting.

The temporary Swimming pool – with the Ice Bowl being the preferred site - is still in the process of being debated on location – a traffic management survey is to happen to deem if it will be workable at the Ice Bowl. On a positive side thoughts were that it could attract more people to the Ice Bowl and there would be a higher footfall in the building.

The Young Curlers have requested lockers – often they come straight from school with lots of bags, it would be at their own risk ,these lockers are being looked into.

A question was raised about the possibility of a vending machine / coffee machine to be made available for use outwith the Catering hours.

The prepaid Vouchers – some confusion had arose over the difference between Adult and Child Vouchers, there is a distinction on the voucher, printing on different colours would be too costly.

John Graham commented on the very high standard of the ice this season, being very keen and having good draws on it, compliments to the Ice Bowl staff for a good start to the season! It was also good to see the sticky mats down and being used. Katie agreed – the staff are passionate about the ice and put a lot of effort into maintaining it to a high standard, a balance is to be reached with the standards in the rest of the building.

A request was put forward for an extra umpires course, the last one was full and there may be a need for one for the volunteers in readiness for the World Championships.

After meetings with Graham Sloan, a need has been identified and the groundwork started to restart the Hub Group and to get it registered. They have been to two sessions so far, 7 people + 2 physios at the first one.

An etiquette starter pack is to be designed for new curlers – clothing, wheel cleaning etc. An application for funding has been made, at the end of the summer, to Scottish Seafarms. John Graham suggested it would advantageous if a member of the Hub Group attend DIBCA meetings. Rosemary asked if they could use the DIBCA bank account for the time being until they got themselves sorted with their own bank account. (Rosemary is away now for six weeks). Graham Sloan had suggested that they may like to run competitions on a Wednesday 2-4pm.

John Graham, on behalf of the committee, was very enthusiastic and asked how DIBCA could help to promote the Hub. Firstly to request use of the DIBCA bank account (to see David Owen) and secondly for a member to join the committee.

Billy Green offered assistance with coaching for them.
It was agreed to put the Hub Group as an agenda 'item'
